It is during these intense weather events that keeping a large support organization like MCRI operational becomes very critical to the needs of all our members.

Actually as our administrative team will admit, even on lovely sunny summer days the operational requirements of the organization can be difficult to maintain and usually staffing requirements are at the top of the list of concerns. Yet even after 30 years with this organization I am still amazed by the level of dedication proven by the vast majority of our staff during difficult times such as the recent ice and snow storms.

Even though many of our staff had personal emergencies caused by the power outages, they remained concerned about organizational responsibilities and the needs of our members. During the ice storm our main office location as well as our West Lane community residence was without power for several days. Many front line staff still found ways to get to work, some who were not working but knew they could get to work if needed called in to offer assistance to fill shifts. Stephanie Haynes who was unlucky enough to be on call during the ice storm, fielded dozens of calls while still completing many of her SILP supervisor duties. This is dedication to service, this is what makes MCRI an exceptional service provider and makes me proud to be part of the organization.

I want to thank everyone who made an extra effort or simply did what was expected of them without question. Hopefully our winter storm worries are over and we can soon get out to the range soon to hit

Ingredients

- cups rhubarb, cut into 3/4 " pieces
- 1cup sugar
- ½cup flour
- ½teaspoon cinnamon
- 1cup flour
- 1cup brown sugar
- ½cup rolled oats
- ½cup melted butter

Directions

Combine rhubarb, sugar, flour and cinnamon and put into 8" x 8" x 2" glass baking dish.


Combine flour, brown sugar, rolled oats and melted butter and sprinkle streusel over rhubarb mixture.

Bake at 375 F for 35 minutes.
